

Words from the Headteacher

Dear Parent/Carer

It was great to see Year 10 this week moving around D block and enjoying their option lessons. We had strict social distancing and a one-way system, but it was still a very positive week. A Level lessons were very well attended and students seem relieved to be getting back to some normality.

Our planning for September continues and will include the regulations outlined by the Department of Education yesterday. Our Plan A is for a full reopening of school in line with government guidelines, which we are still thinking through because it is very complicated! Our Plan B is a contingency plan based on 1m+ social distancing, Plan C is based on 2m social distancing and Plan D addresses the possibility of another full lockdown due to a spike.

There is so much uncertainty nationally, but I want to reassure you that we will manage the situation and we will continue to support your children in every possible way that we can. I will communicate these plans in more detail before the end of term so that our whole school community can take a well-earned rest, knowing that we are fully prepared for the future – whatever that may look like.

I fully appreciate that uncertainty about September is frustrating, but we are living through unprecedented times. Rest assured that the wellbeing of our students remains at the heart of everything we do.

I hope families who have children starting BFS in Year 7 next term have found the information provided this week helpful and reassuring. Our transition plans are at the forefront of our planning and we are very much looking forward to Year 7 joining the BFS family in September.

Next week we have our Annual Awards presentation, where teachers and Year Leaders have nominated students to be rewarded for subject excellence and sustained effort over this academic year. Last year was such a wonderful evening event with parents and students. We are sorry that we cannot replicate it this year, however we are determined that students this year do not miss out and will be acknowledged and rewarded despite the lockdown setback.

Finally on Friday 10 July, Year 7, Year 8 and Year 9 students have been invited into school for an academic mentoring interview with their tutor or a teacher. We are very much looking forward to seeing students again and being able to reassure them about returning to school in September.

Accelerated Reader - Free access to books!

Unlock Cyber Virtual Challenge

Four Y8 students took part in an Unlock Cyber Virtual challenge powered by Immersive Labs - the first time this has been held virtually - and this is what they thought of the experience:

"Last Wednesday, Dario HS, Jamie S, Josh M and Carl R represented BFS at an online Cyber Challenge. A few weeks beforehand we prepared by reviewing parts of cyber security that we have already learnt and then we had to extend our knowledge by looking up new topics such as windows registry keys and looking at metadata to learn information about a picture. It was a two hour long challenge. We had to work as fast as possible to win points. We pioneered, i.e. finished before anyone else had finished, the first badge in less than half an hour but then the other challenges were more difficult and we did not complete another one. We answered a few questions on all of the remaining labs, so we managed to maximise the amount of points we could get. We ended up coming eighth out of 30 teams that were partaking, with an overall score of 44%. The winning team got 84%. I highly recommend this challenge to future Year 8s. Thank you to Mrs Sherman who gave us the chance to attend this challenge." *Carl R Y8*

Uniform Shop Relocation


Our uniform supplier, Famous School Branches, has relocated from Henleaze to their flagshop North Bristol store at Stoke Gifford.


It is wonderful to see more students using their spare time to be creative.


GCSE Artists






