YEAR 9 UNIVERSITY VISITS

The whole of Year 9, were taken off school site to visit the University of the West of England.

It was an excellent day whereby the students gained an insight into higher education. The university ran a bespoke day explaining to our students the wide variety of education choices and career possibilities. This included an introductory talk and interactive workshops, as well as a campus tour and speaking to student ambassadors.

The university and staff commented on how well behaved and mature our students were - well done Year 9!



EMPLOYER TALKS

In the last few weeks we have carried on with our employer talks, which are becoming increasingly popular with our students at Bristol Free School. They are great way for students to engage and hear about a wide range of career paths and to build relationships with local employers.

It has been a bumper year this year within the Sixth Form and we want to say a big well done to our students on their hard work this year.

The students led a number of fundraising initiatives; raising hundreds of pounds for our house charities through a Halloween Bake Sale, raising over £600 for Ukraine through another bake sale, raising money for the Royal British Legion through our Poppy Appeal and collecting a multitude of food donations to support the North Bristol Foodbank. They engaged in over 60 enrichment programmes from Model United Nations to Duke of Edinburgh to the Bristol University STEM UP Programme.





WORK EXPERIENCE

Year 12 students worked with fifty-three different employers from across the country during their recent Work Experience Week. Industries included sport, education, medicine, architecture, textiles, data science and many more. Year 13 students all either applied for a university place or for an apprenticeship - with two students being offered places to study at Oxbridge (Geography and Natural Sciences).

Students also worked on their preparedness for future careers through the completion of MOOCs ('Massive Online Open Courses'), a 1-2-1 40-minute interview with an independent careers advisor, interview practice and CV writing workshops.

KEEPING POSITIVE

Covid caused some disruption cancelling our Halloween Social and Christmas Social and causing many students to self-isolate, but we were impressed by the resilience of the students. In particular those in Year 13 who continued to study diligently despite being unsure as to what form the exam would take in lune.

MR SMITH

We have worked with students through our weekly study skills programme to help instil this resilience and to give them the expertise in revision strategies that they did not have the opportunity to gain due to the cancellation of their GCSE exams.

WELCOME

Finally, we were pleased to be recognised for our work by Ofsted. They said that 'students in the sixth form are particularly positive about the ways in which the school helps to prepare them for life in modern Britain' and that 'sixthform students have good support from knowledgeable staff'.

We also look forward to welcoming roughly 100 students in September into our new Year 12 cohort. Our vision is to support those students as they develop as a person, secure strong attainment in their exams and move on to some of the most prestigious universities and apprenticeships in the world.

We wish all of our students and their parents/carers a restfilled and happy break over the Summer Holidays.



HOUSE PARLIAMENT

We finished the year with a flurry of activity on student action.

We said farewell to our Year 13 Head Students who have served the school so well during a covidaddled period. Emily, Ben, Ameer and Lily worked on issues as diverse as mental health, violence against women, fundraisers and inclusion. They were a real asset to the school leadership and gave valuable feedback from a student perspective. They go on to further study and we wish them all the best as they become BFS Alumni. We appointed four new Head Students from a very strong field of eleven applicants. Charlie, Natalie, Hugh and Lucy will be working with their House Parliament Subcommittees on a number of areas of student action.

The House Parliament has recently organised the Move a Mile Ukraine Fundraiser which raised £1,841 to support the Disasters Emergency Committee and took our total fundraising for Ukraine to over £2,500. They have also recently been working on a number of newsletter articles, on planning for our Cultural Week in September, on our bid to gain the Eco Schools flag and on planning for other events including Mental Health Week. Finally, the Competitions and Events subcommittee have begun planning a number of house competitions for next year.

We also recently surveyed all of our students to capture their feedback on the strengths and areas for improvement for the school. Students were consistently positive about the quality of the teaching that they receive, about the relationships that they have with their teachers and about the extra-curricular programme on offer. Students raised their desire for more trips (something we are keen to explore as we exit the pandemic restrictions) and raised their desire for the school to continue to become more eco-friendly. The senior staff team and the House Parliament will now review the feedback and get to work supporting students on these issues.









Sports day was hot hot hot, but fortunately not as hot as the last few days! High temperatures required lots of rehydration for all our brilliant athletes and it was such a pleasure to watch so many of our students taking part and really enjoying the day. It does provide such a lovely sense of community. Wellies were wanged, rounders were run and races were run – but in the end there has to be one winner. The 2022 Sports Day Winners are...... 





YEAR 8 PRODUCT DESIGN

MRS GORDON

Mrs Gordon's Y8 Product Design group completed their pewter cast keychains last week. Students learnt how to cut and shape copper or brass; they then donned leather apron, gauntlets and full-face visor to use the gas torch at the brazing hearth to melt pewter which was then poured into a three-part mold. There is always a 'wow' moment when the gas torch is lit for the first time - think flame thrower! Some students then developed their metalwork skills by creating some enameled jewellery - a first at BFS. Super work Y8!









The same group had a paper aeroplane challenge. Students had to follow set criteria to win points. Well done to team 'Evie & Isla' who won first place on solid scores for each section. A massive well done to David whose plane travelled the furthest at over 16 metres (18m if straight), and to Mohammed whose plane travelled 15m. We were all so impressed.

CYBERFIRST SCHOOL SILVER AWARD



Bristol Free School has been awarded the Silver award in recognition of excellence in cyber security education, as part of the CyberFirst Schools initiative run by the National Cyber Security Centre (NCSC) – a part of GCHQ.

The CyberFirst Schools programme recognises secondary schools and further education colleges that can demonstrate their passion for inspiring the next generation of cyber security experts and addressing the UK's cyber skills gap.

Being a CyberFirst School comes with a number of benefits including official recognition from the NCSC and opportunities to collaborate with more than 130 CyberFirst partner organisations from a range of sectors on cyber related activities.
