
Dear Parents, Carers, and Students,


EAR 12




Fantastic work!

English?



The English Department were pleased to enjoy ending December with our first Shakespeare Showcase. Students have been working hard learning about Shakespeare through his comedic play *A Midsummer Night's Dream* and had spent two weeks rehearsing pivotal scenes from the play. Year 7 were extremely creative with this, and it was wonderful to see an array of props and costumes on the day.

For the first part of the lesson, half the year group were performers and the other half audience. Each group of audience moved through the English block to see four mini scenes acted out. The audience and cast then swapped halfway through the lesson so each Year 7 student participated as an actor and audience member. We were really proud to see excellent and supportive behaviour throughout, with several students given standing ovations after brilliant performances.

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It was really fun watching my friends perform.


I liked the rehearsals the most and figuring out how we were going to make it the best performance.

Work Experience Employer Talks Careers Day



In our first Employer Talk of the new year, we were delighted to welcome Liz Cornwell, a hydrologist and water resource expert from the Environment Agency in Bristol. Liz described her career journey and gave lots of examples of the roles she has done in her 20-year career, from hydrologist to water resources adviser. She also gave



students a good insight into other jobs available in the environment and water sector, including ecologists, engineers, computer modellers, social scientists, economists and lawyers.



Liz described her passion for making a difference to the world around her, making sure the water that comes out of our taps is safe, that there is enough water for everyone and still enough left in the environment to keep plants, wildlife and rivers safe. She also explained why a career in water in the environment could be a good choice for students, with good job prospects due to the constant demand for talent at apprentice and graduate level. She also shared some of her career highlights: working on a reservoir

enlargement scheme and being at the opening with Sir David Attenborough, and her two-minutes of fame being interviewed on Sky News.

In terms of how to get into an environmental career, Liz herself studied Geography at university, but said there are lots of other subject areas that could lead students into the field including Chemistry, Biology, Ecology, Maths, Statistics, Economics and even Psychology.

This was a practical, interesting and informative talk, with lots of advice on how to access the environment and water sector through an apprenticeship or the university route, and plenty of examples of the organisations students can approach for work experience, apprenticeships and graduate roles.


